



What are the challenges for the railways to serve an ageing society?






It is and will always be important to ensure that older people can actively participate in society and continue to carry out necessary everyday activities

Physical and other constraints are a basic consideration






The railway stations (stations to be "made user friendly")

 - Navigation in the railway station





Conclusion

- The <u>railways also have to respond</u> to this challenge, by considering how to meet the needs of the ageing population.
- The <u>preparation of the journey</u> by rail needs to be rethought, the <u>railway stations</u> and <u>rolling stock</u> need to be redesigned, the <u>front-line staff</u> needs to be retrained and finally the needs of the <u>passengers</u> <u>themselves</u> needs to be considered.
